GENERAL NOTES

- All pupils need a regulation school sports bag and black briefcase.
- Lockers are provided for book and belongings storage for pupils in Years 5, 6, 7 & 8.

CLOTHING LIST

- It is vital that all items are clearly named, so that if lost, they may be easily returned to the owner.

The following items are compulsory for all boys and may only be purchased from the official school outfitters

School Blazer
School Tie
School Tracksuit (for Rugby) available from the Bursar
Football jersey (blue, reversible with gold band)
School football socks
School navy swimming trunks

The following are optional items, but if purchased, they must be obtained from the school outfitter:

Long sleeved or sleeveless 'v' neck pullover (plain type with red band)
Regulation navy blue school coat*
School scarf*
School hat*

The following items are compulsory but they may be obtained from other sources if that is more convenient.

White long sleeved shirts
Medium grey long trousers
Plain grey socks
Plain black shoes (boots are not permitted)
Plain white T-shirt for PE (round neck, short sleeved)
Plain white PE shorts
Plain white PE socks
Navy football shorts
Predominantly white trainers with non-marking sole
House Top (ask at School Reception regarding availability)
Rugby/soccer boots
Mouth Guard (compulsory for Rugby)
Shin Pads (compulsory for Football)

Boys selected for school cricket teams will require the following (coaches will advise)

Cricket shirt
Cricket trousers (white/cream)
Cricket shoes
Cricket socks

Apart from wristwatches, no jewellery is permitted.
