CORE SUBJECTS

English Comprehension, Spellings and Handwriting. Guided and Independent Reading. Children will explore Indian folk tales and myths before performing their own oral re-telling and written adaptations. They will learn about adverbial clauses to make their writing more interesting and use commas to organise their writing. Using grammatical terminology, specifically using and recognising adjectives, nouns and prepositional phrases; using prepositions to express time, place and cause. Humorous poetry. Non-chronological reports: Extending the range of sentences with more than one clause: compound and complex sentences; using commas after or before phrases and clauses; using pronouns to avoid repetition or ambiguity and to add clarity and cohesion.

<u>Maths</u>

Mental addition & subtraction of several numbers. Mental multiplication & division, weekly tests. Number & place value, comparing 4 digit numbers. Fractions, ratio & algebra – finding fractions of amounts. Measurement, tell the time – digital and analogue. Converting cm to mm, kg to g, l to ml. Decimals & percentages – the relationship between tenths and decimals.

Problem solving.

Science

<u>Magnets and Forces</u> – How different surfaces affect speed, identifying how forces act on different objects, magnet strength and magnet poles. <u>Animals including humans</u> – Types and amounts of nutrition, types and functions of a skeleton, naming bones and how muscles move.
