CORE SUBJECTS

<u>English</u>

Weekly spellings and handwriting linked to spellings. Weekly comprehensions.

Guided and independent reading.

Children will explore Indian folk tales and myths and create their own adaptations. They will learn to use adverbial clauses to make their writing more interesting and commas to organise their writing. Using and recognising adjectives, nouns and prepositional phrases; using prepositions to express time, place and cause. Humorous poetry.

Non-chronological reports:

Extending the range of sentences with more than one clause: compound and complex sentences; using commas after or before phrases and clauses; using pronouns to avoid repetition or ambiguity and to add clarity and cohesion.

<u>Maths</u>

Mental addition & subtraction of several numbers. Mental multiplication & division, weekly tests. Number & place value, comparing 4 digit numbers. Fractions, ratio & algebra - finding fractions of amounts. Measurement, tell the time - digital and analogue. Converting cm to mm, kg to g, I to ml. Decimals & percentages - the relationship between tenths and decimals. Problem solving

<u>Science</u>

<u>Electricity</u> – Protons, neutrons and electrons, electrical equipment, creating circuits, conductors and insulators and switches.

<u>Sound</u> - Vibrations, hearing sounds, pitch, creating a string telephone, soundproofing, and making music,

<u>R.E.</u>

<u>Family</u> - Family trees - where do I come from? Jesus' family rooted in Scripture. <u>Judaism -</u> Holy Books - The Torah and its importance.

Belonging - Baptism and Confirmation.

<u>Advent/Christmas</u> - Loving, the gift of love and friendship, the Christmas story.

French: - introduction of Reading and Writing in French, using previously covered topics such as my name, age, where I live and greetings.
