CORE SUBJECTS

<u>English</u>

Comprehension skills. Continued handwriting practice to form and join letters accurately. Grammar- pronouns, prepositional phrases, fronted adverbials, commas, apostrophes, superlatives, power of 3 sentences and powerful verbs. We will be studying 'Beowolf' which will allow us to produce some imaginative work in our creative English lessons. Children will also create a non-chronolgical report on dragons.

<u>Maths</u>

We are starting with three weeks on Multiplication and Division focusing on tables up to 12. We will be using formal written layouts to solve problems. A week on 'Area' follows where we will be finding the area of rectilinear shapes. A unit of fractions will then follow where the children will be adding and subtracting fractions, calculating quantities and solving real life problems. Decimals will end the term where we solve simple measure and money problems involving fractions and decimals to two decimal places.

<u>Science</u> During the first half term we will be setting the children various STEM challenges in preparation for our STEM Day and 3M Challenge. In the second half we will be looking at a unit on 'Sound' which will include identifying how sounds are made, how sound travels, looking at pitch leading up to making our own musical instruments!

<u>R.E.</u>

Local church – Community. Belonging to a community and the life of the local Christian community.

Music- 2/4 time, Pentatonic tonesets, Reinforce left and right, Reinforce ta-ah, tika tika, tika te tetika rhythm concepts, Syncopa rhythm concept and Project Ukulele.
